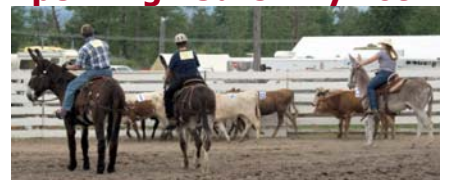

Weekend Donkey Buggy & Wagon Rentals

Kingma Farm has several vehicles that we use, depending on the occasion.

Cost for the first hour on each vehicle is shown here.

Additional hours are available at \$50.00 per hour, whether we are at your location or at our farm.

You're welcome to come to Kingma Farm where you'll enjoy an old fashion ride on rolling prairie gravel roads winding through canyons and around the fields.

The Burgundy Wagonette is a classy wagon pulled by Team Donk with two bench seats that face each other. It has wooden tires and will comfortably seat four to six adults with room for one more next to the driver. This rents for \$275. the first hour at locations near Grangeville. Your hour begins when we are hitched and ready to go. If you come to Kingma Farm we will travel on gravel roads for \$175. the first hour. A two hour one way trip to Grangeville is available and makes for a relaxing outing.

Choose a buggy ride in the Pacific Gig or Show Buggy pulled by one of our well trained mammoth donkeys. The metal frame with metal wheel carts will seat one other person beside the driver. These are classy well balanced vehicles. Each buggy rents for \$150. per hour at your location or \$75. at our farm. Trips scheduled over 20 miles from Kingma Farm will be extra to your location.

Donkey Talk

Jack: male donkey

Jennet: Female Donkey

Foal: Baby donkey

Miniature Donkey: up to 36" tall

Standard Donkey: from 36" to 48" tall

Large Standard Donkey: 48" up to 56" (Luc's size)

Mammoth Jackstock" 54" and up for jennets 56" and up for jacks and geldings (Liberty's size)



Fun Donkey Facts

Donkeys bred to donkeys produce DONKEYS. Donkey, Burro, Ass, Jackass, Jennet, Jenny, John, Jack, Miniature donkey, Mammoth, Jackstock, Standard, Large Standard, Mexican Burro are all terms for donkeys.

A male donkey (Jack) bred to a female horse produces a mule which can be either male or female.

A male horse (stallion) bred to a female donkey (jennet or jenny) produces a HINNY. Hinnies can be either male or female.

Twins are 10 times more common in donkeys than in horses. Fewer than 1 in 1,000 sets of twins in horses are estimated to be born healthy and alive; in donkeys 1 in 100 sets will survive.

A group of donkeys is called a herd.

Horses carry their babies for 11 months, donkeys for 12. A mare carrying a mule foal is usually about 11 ½ months.
